William Newton Case, 91, of Waimea, passed away on August 16, at Queen’s North Hawai‘i Community Hospital. Born in North Kohala in 1933 to Mabel Hussey, descended from those of ‘Awini and Niuli‘i, and Leonard Newton Case, noted Waimea veterinarian. William, known as "Bill" or “Casey” retired in 1998 from Parker Ranch after 40 years, having last served as Water Superintendent, he continued to be an integral part of the ranching and farming community of Waimea and an honorary member of Mauna Kea Education and Awareness. William was preceded in death by his wife, Delma (Begas) Case in 2022. He is survived by daughters, Bonnie Pualani Case (E. 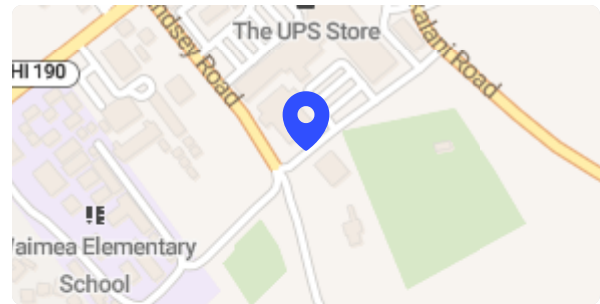
